

The South Downs Way

For 3 players starting at Winchester, Cocking and Eastbourne
or 4 players starting at Winchester, Buriton, Petworth and Eastbourne

The operators are building a narrow gauge tourist line which may not connect with existing railway stations with the exception of Winchester and Eastbourne. Bridging national railway lines (black dotted line) costs the same as rivers. Lines may not extend beyond the national park boundaries (green area). The orange hexes are bus connections for special runs and companies have permission to build track into and through these. Special runs are: S1 = Southampton, S2 = Portsmouth, S3 = Farnham & Guildford, S4 = Bognor & Chichester, S5 = Brighton and S6 = Crawley.

Beauty spots (star symbol) and country parks (tree symbol) are worth 3 for the first to connect. In all races, the operators' routes must include at least one beauty spot or country park to be valid. When connecting to a beauty spot or country park, a turntable is installed at no extra cost. During the race this can be used to allow the train to double back if the operator is unable or does not wish to pass through the hex. Using the turntable costs 1 movement point paid for by the incoming or outgoing die roll.

It is recommended that the first die roll is a 4 and the build allowance for round 7 is 12 units.
